Watercolour Music Release "The Hangman"



Written, recorded and performed by Nick Turner and Brian Jamieson, The Hangman as released on Labour Day, May 2015 to coincide with the UK National Elections.

The Hangman was written by Maurice Ogden in the 1950's. Perceived by many as being a commentary on the rise of Fascism in Europe, it also may allude to events much closer to home such as the rise of McCarthyism in the USA. The film, released in 1964, was animated by Margaret Julian, directed by Les Goldman and Paul Julian with music from Serge Hovey.

"No Pasarán" (They shall not pass) was popularised during the Spanish Civil War and has become a favourite rallying cry against Fascism
